BACKFLOW TESTING UPDATE

2017 marked the first year of implementing the updated cross-connection policy within the Association. This allowed the Association to contract for a group rate to perform the required testing on all backflow devices within the association and to bill a one-time fee for this service on each member's June billing statement. While there may have been some confusion on the part of a few members requiring them to cancel annual testing previously arranged, the Board is very pleased with the results. This is the first year we have achieved 100% compliance by our stated deadline of September 30 without having to track down missing reports or contact individuals who had neglected their testing. As a result, we feel we have saved time and money and will be able to submit the required report to the state agency in a timely fashion.
